

IMPORTANT: RE-BOOKING SECOND PFIZER VACCINATION

The Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) and Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) published new advice last week which says second doses of both the Pfizer and Oxford AstraZeneca can now be given up to 12 weeks after the first dose to give more people the protection of a first vaccination, which is shown to reduce hospitalisations and serious illness. This is to protect the greatest number of at risk people overall in the shortest possible time and to achieve the greatest impact on reducing mortality and hospitalisations and protecting the NHS. This approach was supported by the four UK Chief Medical Officers.

As a result we have started contacting staff and patients who have a second jab booked next week to cancel their appointments. We will be in touch in due course to rearrange their second appointment for between 10 and 12 weeks after their first vaccination. We understand you may feel anxious and upset to have your second appointment cancelled, but please bear with us and you **will** be contacted to re-book another appointment.

Please do NOT contact the Trust's vaccination centre as we will be in touch with you. We are prioritising staff according to if they are shielding, the clinical area they work in and their age.



Just a quick reminder that care homes in the district can still request up to £3,000 additional ICF grant to help cover costs of supporting visiting in their home. The process will remain open until 5 February 2021. You can submit your request at any point during this period and we will be reviewing and processing requests on at least a fortnightly basis

MESSAGE FROM THE DIGITAL CARE HUB TEAM TO ALL CARE HOMES
