UPDATE ON GLOVES

The UKHCA has released updated information on the use of vinyl gloves, please see the attachment in the <u>Provider Zone</u> for the full information.

We would still recommend using a risk assessment when using vinyl gloves for personal care, but the urgency to purchase and provide other types of gloves (nitrile, latex and neoprene) is no longer an issue.

UPDATE ON FLU VACCINATIONS



There is high demand for flu jabs currently with both pharmacies and GP practices 'controlling' their supplies to those in the 'at risk' categories. The Government has given assurances that it has procured over 30 million vaccines this year and that further stocks will be released in November.
