COMMUNITY PROJECTS

The Bradford District Credit Union, together with the West Yorkshire Combined Authority (WYCA) and Bradford Council, have launched some great projects to help our community.

Our efforts, including the <u>UniformSavers</u> and <u>FoodSavers</u>, programmes, have helped us grow from 3,000 to 10,000 members in 6 years and save a total of £7 million. This support is crucial right now with the ongoing cost of living crisis.

We're especially excited about our new project, the <u>Spring Back to School Loan</u> backed by WYCA Mayor Tracy Brabin's office. It's designed to help people with low credit scores get back on their feet. The Mayor is showing her support by visiting us in March. See the <u>attachment</u> for more details

Also, the mayor is funding <u>UniformSavers#3</u> that launched this week on <u>BBC News</u> this week. It's aimed at helping single parents by offering them £100 towards school uniforms if they save £10 a month for three months. This help is available at Britannia House and Keighley Town Hall.

COVID-19 GUIDANCE

Please find a <u>link</u> to the latest guidance on managing Covid19 and other respiratory illnesses in care settings. The new guidance brings the management of Covid 19 cases/outbreaks in line with that of flu and other respiratory illnesses by reducing the infectivity period from 14 to 5 days. This means that an outbreak would be considered only if it was 2 or more linked cases within 5 days in a care home or other care setting.

Also <u>attached</u> is an updated version of the Care Home Manual which includes the link to the new guidance.




