PPE guidelines for Street Support/Street Outreach/Homeless Hostels (02.07.2020)

PPE guidelines issued by Public Health England (PHE) do not specifically mention homeless outreach or hostel settings at present. These local guidelines have been compiled using the PHE guidelines for community/primary care settings.

PPE available for homeless outreach and hostels

Face masks should be Type IIR fluid resistant surgical masks which are single or continuous use. Continuous use should be considered in most cases to ensure economical use of available stock. When you need to remove your mask (e.g. to take a drink, eat, if visibly soiled or damp) then you need to dispose of it safely. Do not dangle your face mask or eye protection around your neck.

Plastic aprons should be available and are single use and disposable.

Disposable gloves should be available in a range of sizes (small/medium/large). Nitrile gloves are preferred.

Eye/face protection may be single or reusable face/eye protection/full face visor or goggles.

When to wear PPE

Due to the nature of the clients we serve, it is advisable to wear a face mask **at all times** when in an environment where you may come into contact with clients. This includes on the street if working in an outreach capacity or in a building if working in a hostel or hotel environment.

When delivering direct care/interventions which would require physical interaction with clients (within 1m from the client), their belongings or their home environment, disposable gloves and aprons should be worn and disposed of after each individual encounter.

Eye/face protection should be worn when dealing with possible or confirmed cases of COVID-19 infection in addition to the PPE items mentioned above if within 1m of the client.

Gloves, aprons, face masks and face protection must be worn when taking a COVID-19 swab.

Gloves and/or aprons should not be worn at any other time.

Appropriate social distancing, including remaining 2m away from clients at any time should be maintained where possible. Hand hygiene should be maintained at appropriate points throughout the day including the use of alcohol hand gel.

Donning PPE

Pre-donning instructions

- Ensure well hydrated
- Remove jewellery
- Tie back hair
- Check correct PPE available in the correct size


Donning instructions



Doffing PPE

- PPE should be removed in an order at minimises the risk of self-contamination
- Gloves, aprons and eye protection (if used) should be taken off in the client's room if appropriate
- PPE items must be disposed of in a clinical waste stream (orange bag)
