### THE LAUNCH OF SOCIAL CARE DAY OF REMEMBRANCE AND REFLECTION

Skills for Care is delighted to join with 20 other social care bodies across England to launch [Social Care Day of Remembrance and Reflection](#), to honour the work of the adult social care workforce during the pandemic, and those we sadly lost.

A total of 21 organisations supported by the Department of Health and Social Care and Minister of State for Social Care Helen Whately, have come together to launch the memorial day dedicated to the adult social care workforce in England, which will be held in March 2022. The past year has been particularly challenging for the social care workforce who have continued to work tirelessly and make huge sacrifice in face of the pandemic. An estimated 922 social care workers in England tragically lost their lives between March 2020 and May 2021.

The purpose of Social Care Day of Remembrance and Reflection is to thank those social care workers who provided crucial care and support during these tough times, and to remember those workers who sadly lost their lives to COVID-19.

## Are you a care worker working in home support services in Bradford & Craven? This course is for YOU!

As part of the Care@Home offer to support people living with frailty with escalating needs during Covid -19 and beyond, Bradford District & Craven CCG and partners would like to embed a recognised consistent approach across the whole system to support care providers to recognise and respond to deterioration and support people to get the right care, at the right time in the right place for the right outcome.

The training will last approximately 75 minutes and we will provide you with a workbook which will include other useful information.

**We will cover:**

- The key role carers play in early identification of deterioration
- How to recognise the soft signs of deterioration (using RESTORE2 Mini)
- To understand why good communication is key to recognising & acting on deterioration
- How to communicate effectively with the ambulance service, hospital, GPs and community Teams using SBARD
- The importance of understanding how your team works together and how to improve on this.

At the end of the course you will have the tools and skills to start to implement these ideas with your colleagues.
