

A research study for homecare workers who have experienced a **double handed homecare** review is taking place with Northumbria University

WHAT IS THE RESEARCH ABOUT?

Researchers at Northumbria University are exploring care at home where two workers are required to be present (double handed homecare), as opposed to a single worker (single handed homecare). They would like to talk to homecare workers who have experience of *both* single handed and double handed homecare.



The purpose of this research is to use these experiences, alongside other information, to provide recommendations on how these reviews should be performed in the future. We are interested in **negative experiences** as well as **positive** ones.

WHO CAN TAKE PART?

Homecare workers with experience of both single and double handed homecare.

WHAT WOULD IT INVOLVE?

A researcher would get in touch with you, give you more information, and give you the opportunity to ask questions. If you then gave consent, the researcher would carry out an interview with you over the telephone or by video link (whatever you prefer) to chat about your experience. This would take up to around 45 minutes.
