### **UKHSA SCABIES ALERT**

## IPC Guidance to Managing Scabies Cases in Communal Residential Settings

- Daily Vacuuming of all carpets & soft furnishings, until at least 7 days after treatment started
- Steam cleaning of all soft furnishings, carpet shampooing will not be as effective at killing the mite
- Transmission through the environment and environmental objects (Fomite) is a higher risk when Norwegian Scabies is diagnosed
- Always wear Gloves and apron when in close contact and doff the PPE appropriately into a foot operated bin
- Avoid excess shaking of any single-use apron when taking off the apron, use appropriate doffing method to avoid any extra potential shedding of the mites, this can be important for taking gloves off as well
- Separate all laundry, red bag any laundry, wash separately on the hottest cycle: 60 Degrees plus
- No sharing of any towels or bed linen, all items should be for the persons use and not to be shared with anyone

# BRADFORD COUNCIL PROPOSES SPECIAL NEEDS SCHOOL PLACES

Bradford Council has set out a proposal to create an additional 450 special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) school places across the district over the next 12 months. The report going to the Council's Executive on 2 December will show how these plans aim to meet future demand for school places.

The places will be created by expanding existing special schools as well as by creating additional places within mainstream schools in the district. The proposals could also see the upgrading of other existing buildings. The money to do this is from funding the Council receives from the Government for SEND provision.

# #ProvidersUnite Stronger Together

We are sharing an important call to action on behalf of Providers Unite, who have drafted an open letter to the Home Secretary in response to the newly announced immigration and earned settlement reforms.

These proposals will have significant implications for our sector, particularly for the thousands of international care workers who have become an essential part of the workforce. While certain NHS routes remain protected, social care has once again been overlooked despite being one of the sectors most dependent on international recruitment to meet the needs of the people we support.

Providers Unite have voiced deep concern that the changes will:-

- Create further instability within an already stretched workforce
- Place additional pressure on providers who are working hard to maintain safe, consistent services
- Cause long term uncertainty for dedicated care staff who have built their lives and families here
- Increase risk to service continuity, safeguarding, and provider sustainability

We are encouraging all members to read and, if you wish to do so, sign the open letter.

This is an opportunity for our sector to speak with one voice and ensure that the impact on social care is fully understood before these proposals move forward.
