Hi all – Men with learning disabilities have a low uptake of their Triple A screening which we would like to try and improve. Currently only about 40% of men who are appropriate for screening on the LD register have taken it up.

We are running a clinic at Waddiloves with the Triple A screeners in March (see above poster).

Transforming Public Procurement

The new Procurement Act 2023 has now come into effect.

This has reformed UK public sector procurement rules and any new procurement activity from now on will be subject to the new Act. Any procurement projects commenced prior to 24 February 2025 will be under the previous Public Contract Regulations (2015).

We want to make sure that everyone who does business with us is aware of the changes and how it will affect the way the public sector organisations procure goods, works and services.
