

VACANCIES THAT NEED FILLING?

The Bradford Cares Recruitment Portal for Adult Social Care has been developed for two main purposes: for care providers to advertise their job vacancies; and to inform individuals looking for work about the sector, the range of jobs available and the career / progression opportunities the sector can offer.

Bradford Cares will become a 'one stop shop' to help 'match' people looking for work in the adult care sector with care providers who have job vacancies.

HOW DO I GET MY JOB VACANCIES ON BRADFORD CARES FOR FREE?

BCA will provide a service for independent care providers, who are BCA members, to upload their job vacancies to the portal for no charge.

BCA membership is currently free - if you're not a BCA member already or are unsure if you are, please email admin@bradfordcareassociation.org

Simply email admin@bradfordcareassociation.org requesting the job vacancy form. You will then fill out the form which will ask you questions about the job vacancy.

Once you have completed the job vacancy form, the BCA will add your vacancy to the job portal for free! BCA will keep in touch with you to see if you have success with recruiting using the Bradford Cares Portal.



Additionally, if you have vacancies and are trying to recruit staff, please do contact Bradford SkillsHouse who can help and support you with the entire recruitment process and can provide candidates with Care Certificate training (if the candidate is currently unemployed) for no charge.

Also, if you interview candidates and they are not successful in gaining a position with you, please can you advise the candidates to contact SkillsHouse, who will support them to look for work and undertake relevant care training.

INFECTION PREVENTION AND CONTROL IN ADULT SOCIAL CARE: COVID-19 SUPPLEMENT

ALL CQC-REGISTERED PROVIDERS TO ENSURE THEIR STAFF RECEIVE TRAINING ON INTERACTING WITH PEOPLE WITH A LEARNING DISABILITY AND AUTISTIC PEOPLE

From I July 2022, all health and social care providers registered with CQC must ensure that their staff receive training in how to interact appropriately with people with a learning disability and autistic people, at a level appropriate to their role. This new legal requirement is introduced by the Health and Care Act 2022.

The government will consult on and publish a code of practice in due course. In the meantime, CQC say they will provide guidance and will be looking to see whether providers have provided the required training and assessed staff.

They will also be checking staff work with people appropriately and, if not, what training has been provided.

CQC is expected to update their statutory guidance and website to reflect the new requirement.
