CHANGES TO INTERNATIONAL RECRUITMENT OF CARE WORKERS

On 12th March, the government announced changes relating to international recruitment of care workers and senior care workers. From 9th April, care providers in England who wish to recruit a new worker from overseas, or those switching from another visa route, will have to first prove that they have attempted to recruit a worker from within the UK who is already in the route and needs new sponsorship.

The Home Office are running three webinars providing further information on these changes and what they mean for ASC providers. The sessions will cover:

- Changes to Certificate of Sponsorship requests for sponsoring care workers and senior care workers based entirely in England.
 - Changes to Minimum Salary Requirement
 - Changes to deductions from salary

A SCAM ALERT! A

A provider within the Bradford District informed the People Commissioning Team of an incident that we would like to bring to the attention of our provider networks.

A fraudulent advert was publicised on Indeed using their company name. The provider had no input or knowledge of this advert, before being contacted by an applicant. The advert provided details of a non-existent job and requested money for applications. This was a fraudulent attempt to use the company's reputation to take advantage of vulnerable people.

The provider reported it to the **police** and to Indeed.

If you find yourself in a similar situation:

- Reporting fraud and cyber crime | Action Fraud
 - Contact jobs platform to remove the ad
- Inform applicants of the fake advert and share across relevant networks

Please note this is not legal advice. You may decide to speak with a lawyer if this happens to your organisation.

ALL THINGS STROKE WEBSITE LAUNCHES FOR LOCAL STROKE PATIENTS, FAMILIES AND CARERS

On 25th March 2025, **the West Yorkshire Association of Acute Trusts (WYAAT)** launched the new **All Things Stroke' website**, to support local patients, their families and carers with resources and support relating to stroke.

Designed in collaboration with local stroke survivors, the voluntary sector, and healthcare professionals across WYAAT, the website acts as a 'one-stop-shop' and online directory for stroke advice and information, as well as support groups which can be filtered via location to show results in a user's local community.
