COMMUNITY NURSING - PRIMARY CARE NETWORK RESTRUCTURES

From 12 April 2021 the District Nursing Teams across Bradford, Airedale and Wharfedale have been reconfigured to be aligned with the Primary Care Networks (PCN's). To enable this changes were made to some of the district nursing teams, including realigning the GP Practices and Care Homes that each team supports.

Lists for each GP Practice & Care Home with the new district nursing team that will be supporting them, and the names of the respective team leaders has been uploaded to the <u>Provider Zone</u>

The changes might mean a change to the name of the district nursing team, and some of the staff within the team.

We hope that the changes will enable closer working with Care Homes and General Practice on shared agendas whilst strengthening continuity of care and the associated relationships.

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VACCINATION UPDATE FOR PREGNANT WOMEN

Pregnant women should now be offered a Covid jab when other people their age get one, the UK's vaccine advisers say.

The Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are preferable because data from the U.S. in 90,000 pregnant women has not raised any safety concerns. Up until now, only women with underlying health conditions or those whose risk of exposure to the virus was high were eligible. This shift in advice brings the UK into line with other countries.

Pregnant women are still encouraged to discuss the risks and benefits of the vaccines with their doctor before making the appointment, but it is not a requirement.

COVID-19 VACCINATION AND CLOTTING

We are aware of the concerns there have been regarding clotting, especially with the AstraZeneca vaccine. The Government currently state that this condition remains extremely rare. There appears to be a higher risk in people shortly after the first dose of the AstraZeneca (AZ) vaccine. With around 4 people developing this condition for every million doses of the AZ vaccine given.

However, the risks to every person's health from catching COVID 19 are far greater. We continue to ask every one of you to please get vaccinated when you have the opportunity and say a big thankyou to everyone who has been vaccinated so far.

MHRA UPDATE IN RELATION TO DIFFUPLAST NUTRITION BAGS

The Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) has been notified of a potential issue related to sterilisation of empty parenteral and enteral nutrition bags manufactured by Diffuplast. This could impact both inpatients on parenteral and enteral nutrition and those on home nutrition

Diffuplast, which supplies bags to parenteral nutrition (PN) producers in the UK has recalled one sterilisation batch of PN bags as a result of sterilisation process anomalies. It has also advised additional vigilance for signs of related infection in patients using bags from specific sterilisation batches.

Diffuplast issued a Field Safety Notice yesterday and accompanying patient information will be issued to patients via Gov.uk and additional channels.

The information available indicates that the risk of infection is very low. Patients are asked to continue to use these bags as normal.

The Actions for healthcare professionals are:

- Reassure patients that the risk involved with use of these products is very low.
- Monitor patients as for signs of catheter-related infections.
- Report any suspected infections to your nutrition supplier and through your organisation's local incident reporting system and/or your national incident reporting authority as appropriate: <u>England</u>, <u>Scotland</u>, <u>Northern</u> <u>Ireland</u>, <u>Wales</u>.


Healthcare organisations should always act on FSNs issued by manufacturers. Do not wait for further communication from the MHRA.
