Background


We're running a pilot project to develop and test a peer review process for positive behavioural support (PBS) training.

This involves a number of learning providers who peer review each other's training, to assure adequate quality, give feedback and share ideas. We hope that this will be a successful model to improve the quality of PBS training across the sector.

Scope

The peer review pilot includes, learning providers and assessment bodies working with:

 statutory, private, independent, voluntary providers, and individual employers, that are using PBS with people who have a learning disability and/or autistic people





Feedback

The process is being co-produced with the people involved in the pilot. It is more important than ever that PBS is available.
