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VACCINATION AS A CONDITION OF EMPLOYMENT IN CQC-REGULATED CARE HOMES

The government has announced that people working in Care Quality Commission (CQC)-registered care homes will need to be fully vaccinated with two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine unless they have a medical exemption from October – subject to Parliamentary approval and a subsequent 16-week grace period.

The new regulations will apply to:

- · all workers employed directly by the care home or care home provider
- · those employed by an agency and deployed by the care home
- · volunteers deployed in the care home

It will include those providing direct care and those coming into the home to do other work, such as healthcare workers, tradespeople, CQC inspectors, hairdressers, beauticians

Exemptions include:

- · Anyone who has a medical reason that means they cannot have a vaccine
- · Family and friends visiting a care home resident
- Essential Care Givers
- · Any person providing emergency assistance
- Anyone undertaking urgent maintenance work
- Any person under the age of 18

Any staff or visiting professionals entering a care home will need to provide evidence of their vaccination or exemption status. The Government is working with NHSX to explore the use of the NHS App for demonstrating vaccination status, with alternatives provided for people who do not have access to a smartphone. DHSC are also working on a simple process to allow people to prove their exemption status. Service providers would need to ensure that they have a process of demonstrating to CQC that they are compliant with the regulations. Further details will be outlined in guidance in due course.

Timeline

Regulations will be laid before parliament ASAP. If approved by parliament, there will be a minimum of a 16-week grace period from when the regulations are made to allow staff who are yet to have the vaccine to arrange an appointment.


