NATIONAL PATIENT SAFETY ALERT – RISK ASSOCIATED WITH ADULT BREATHING CIRCUITS LACKING A PATENT EXHALATION ROUTE

NHS England National Patient Safety team in collaboration with the Faculty of Intensive Care Medicine have released an alert in relation to the risk of harm from incorrectly assembled breathing circuits lacking a proper exhalation route for people receiving invasive or non-invasive ventilatory support.

COLD WEATHER PROVISION SUPPORTS BRADFORD'S ROUGH SLEEPERS

We are continuing to put special provision in place so that no-one has to sleep outside during freezing temperatures.

Guidelines suggest that local authorities should provide accommodation for rough sleepers when temperatures are forecast to fall to 0C or below for three consecutive nights. However, we go over and above this, providing emergency bed spaces on any one night that threshold is reached.

The extra provision is put in place, often in the communal area of an existing service, to make sure no-one has to sleep outside. The service which opened again in November 2025 has so far supported 70 people with some benefiting from multiple nights of accommodation.


Cyber Safety Basics for Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults Online
