CAPACITY TRACKER UPDATE

Please be aware that providers of Care Home and Home Support services are legally required to update the Capacity Tracker. This must be completed between the 8^{th} – 14^{th} each month to have a submission recorded.

Non-compliance of 3 consecutive months or 4 periods in a 12 month period may result in the Department of Health and Social Care taking action against providers and fines being issued. The **clock will not be reset in April 2024** (as it was in 2023) and Bradford Council have been informed that enforcement is now commencing. If providers have not reported in the previous reporting windows then they are at risk of action being taken, particularly if the last two reporting windows have already been missed.

Bradford Council also operate a vacancy map for care homes which is used by social workers. The map is populated by care homes showing vacancies on the Capacity Tracker. It is updated each Wednesday. Please ensure your data is up to date each Tuesday to appear on the map.

If any provider does not have access to the Capacity Tracker or need to change the details of their log in please contact the support desk at the Capacity Tracker directly. The Capacity Tracker also have training available on their website, should any provider need support with using the system.

GRANT OPPORTUNITIES FOR COMMUNITY GROUPS

Local Friendship Support Grants – Supporting those living with Dementia and/or Sensory Impairments – Round 3

Do you run a friendship or activities club in the Bradford District which would like to become more welcoming and accessible to people living with dementia and/or with sensory impairments? Do you have ideas about how your group or organisation could support people living with dementia and/or sensory impairments? Do you have an idea of how you could grow or expand your group to help people build friendships, live independently and be engaged with their local community?

Bradford Council are offering a further round of Local Friendship Support Grants of between £250 - £2,000 to local groups to enable them to become more accessible and offer new opportunities to people living with dementia and/or sensory impairments. This funding could be spent on, but is not limited to, activities, events or equipment. It could also be used to set up a new group or help your existing group become more established. Further details of the criteria can be found in the application guidance.

Alternatively, new for this year groups can apply for between £2,000-£5,000 if they have ideas for a larger project.

These grants due to go live on Monday 8 April and all required information will be available on the CNet website at https://cnet.org.uk/Projects/Grants.
