<u>'STAY IN THE KNOW': CHANGES TO OUR COMMUNITY</u> MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

As part of the Bradford District Care Partnership's commitment to keep colleagues from the partnership updated on the community mental health transformation programme, the programme team has set-up 'Stay in the know': changes to their community mental health services sessions. Upcoming session (Monday 19th May, 2.30 to 3.30pm) will focus on the journey for personal health budgets (PHBs) for mental health. Find out how Bradford District and Craven is leading the way for PHBs and how they are seen as an exemplar for this piece of work up and down the country. You will hear from colleagues at Bradford District and Craven Mind, who have played a key role in the delivery of PHBs, and they will talk about why partnership work has been pivotal to the success of PHBs.

ASC CHARGING CONSULTATION

The 12-week consultation period has now ended. We have managed to engage directly, other than via letter, with 35% of the 3,837 people in receipt of non-residential community services that we wrote to.

April - providers have had an opportunity to engage and participate during the consultation process.
