<u>CAPACITY TRACKER – IMPORTANT UPDATE - THE REALITY OF ENFORCEMENT ACTION</u>

Providers of Care Home and Home Support services should be aware that they are legally required to update the Capacity Tracker.

Fresh data should be input between the 8th – 14th each month to have a submission recorded.

If data is not entered for 3 consecutive months OR is missing for 4 periods in a rolling 12-month period, this omission is likely to result in the Department of Health and Social Care taking action against individual providers with the risk of fines being issued. Data input by providers in this case is mandatory.

The clock was re-set in April 2023 and Bradford Council has been informed that enforcement is now commencing. If providers have not reported in the previous reporting windows then they are at risk of action being taken, particularly if the last two reporting windows have already been missed.

Bradford Council also operates a "vacancy map" for care homes which is used by social workers making placements. The map is populated by the care home vacancy data on the Capacity Tracker. It is updated each Wednesday. Our ask is that you ensure your data is up to date **every Tuesday** to appear on the map. Data input by providers in this case is voluntary.

If any provider does not have access to the Capacity Tracker or needs to refresh their login details, please contact the support desk at the Capacity Tracker directly.

IMPAQT FOR CARE has been built and piloted with the support of several Bradford Care Homes and for a limited time is available completely FREE of charge for 12 months.

NEW £76 MILLION COST OF LIVING FUND

Following our campaigning alongside others, the government has launched the £76 million Community Organisations Cost of Living Fund (CCLF).

Delivered in partnership with The National Lottery Community Fund, the CCLF will support organisations across England to deliver critical frontline services.

Applicants to the fund must be:

- offering at least one of: food and emergency supplies, emergency shelter, safe spaces, warmth and financial or housing advice;
- able to demonstrate increased demand and increased costs for those critical services:
 - registered with the Charity Commission or an incorporated not-for-profit company;
- providing services to a local community in England with a focus on small and medium organisations, although national organisations can apply where they can demonstrate local impact.

Organisations will be able to apply for between £10,000 and £75,000 funding to maintain or expand critical cost of living services from now until the end of March 2024.

The deadline for applications is 16 October 2023 at 12 noon.

West Yorkshire Community Climate Grants

£5,000 to £50,000 | Various deadlines

The Mayor of West Yorkshire, Tracy Brabin, and the Combined Authority are working with local authorities to offer grants to fund climate friendly schemes. From creating a bee friendly wildflower meadow, to installing secure bike storage at your community centre – they want to help fund the ideas that will really make a difference to your neighbourhood.




