

# Self-neglect Professional Practice Session

This **face-to-face** professional practice session explores the complex nature of self-neglect and how this relates to safeguarding adults as well as issues surrounding mental capacity. This interactive session will also explore how self-neglect is associated with hoarding and other complex issues. Practitioners from housing officers to social workers, police and health professionals can find working with people who self-neglect extremely challenging. In this session professionals will work through a case study exploring these complexities and look at how we can offer people support without causing distress and understand the limitations to our interventions if the person does not wish to engage.

# Financial Exploitation and Abuse Training

*The West Yorkshire Financial Exploitation and Abuse Team (WYFEAT) offers a comprehensive training session designed for professionals to address financial abuse and exploitation. This free, 90-minute session delves into how financial abuse is covered under The Care Act 2014 and provides practical measures to safeguard service users from scams and doorstep crime.*

*The training includes real case studies from victims in West Yorkshire to illustrate the team's work and emphasizes the importance of changing the stigma associated with being scammed.*

*Additionally, the session explains the role of WYFEAT, the referral process, and the support available to victims.*

# Personalised Safeguarding in practice

This interactive 3 – hour learning session explores what it really means to make safeguarding personal. Using a local Safeguarding Adult Review (SAR) as a case study, participants will examine real practice challenges and identify how a personalised approach can strengthen safeguarding outcomes.

Through guided discussion, reflection, and practical activities, the session will:

Highlight key findings and themes from the SAR.

Explore the importance of voice, choice, and control in safeguarding practice.

Consider what “good” looks like when safeguarding is truly personal.

Identify practical strategies to embed personalised safeguarding in day-to-day work.

By the end of the session, participants will leave with a deeper understanding of how personalised safeguarding makes a difference, and with clear actions they can take back into their own practice and organisations.

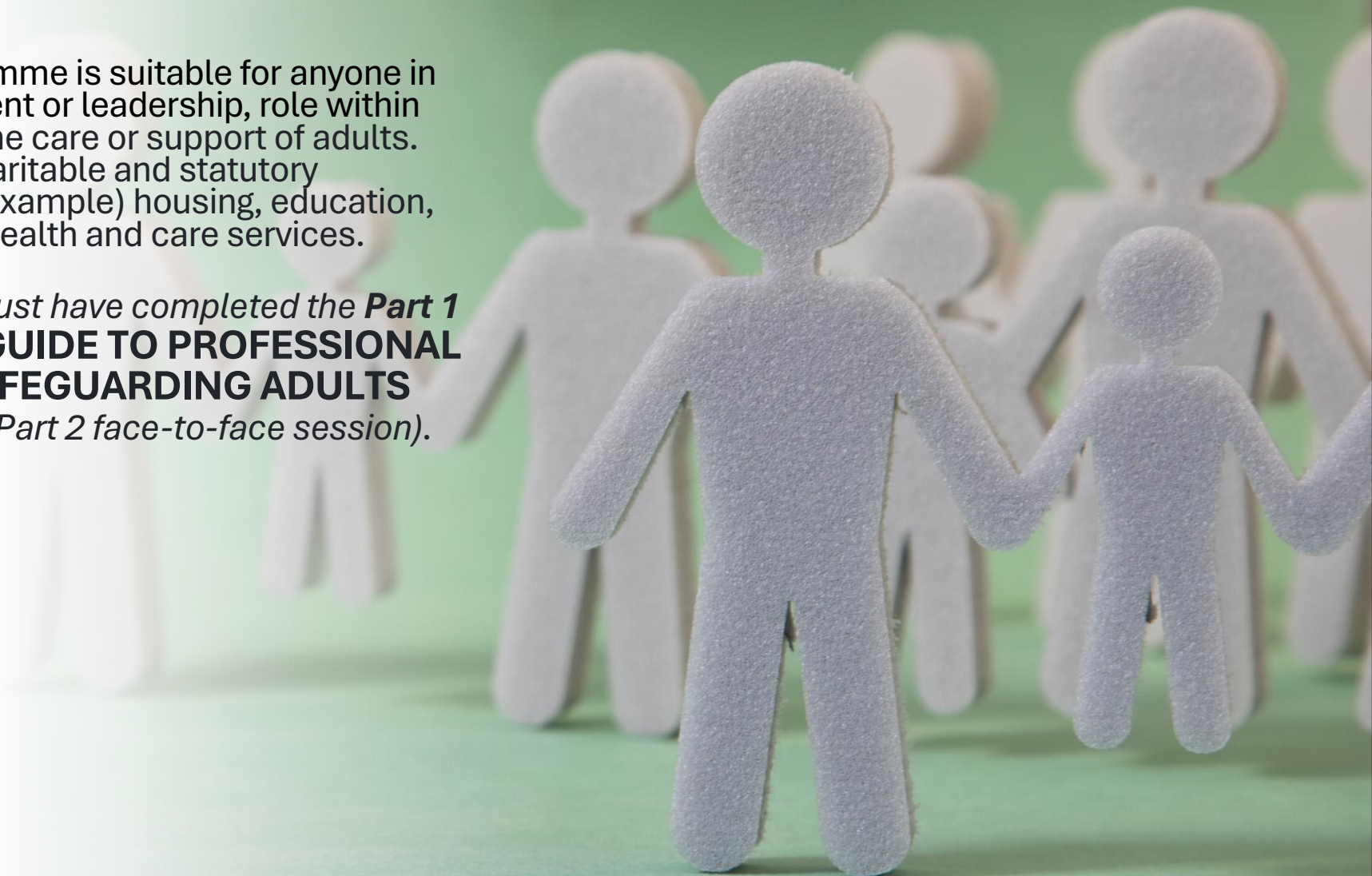

# Cultural competency and Humility Training

This **face-to-face** training is for partners working and volunteering with adults and children, this provides a great opportunity for people to share their experiences.

## Training will cover :

- **Understanding culture both individually and within a wider social context.**
- **Understanding self, including cultural humility.**
- Becoming aware of our own cultural norms, attitudes, beliefs, and behaviours.
- To examine our own personal biases, stereotypes, and prejudices.
- Better understand what unconscious bias is and to reflect upon their own.
- Understanding what is meant by 'culture' and why it is important for health professionals to be aware of how this can impact health.
- Understanding the impact cultural differences might have on interactions with others.
- Become comfortable with "*not knowing*" – Balancing their expert knowledge with being open to learning from the community and people's lived experiences.
