To celebrate this milestone Bradford Council is holding an Open Weekend on Saturday 9 and Sunday 10 September. The Open Weekend is part of the nationwide Heritage Open Days festival and Bradford City Hall will be open for tours and activities.

There will also be a self-guided tour of key areas in the city centre taking in other heritage building such as Bradford Cathedral (which will also be open for tours on Saturday 9 September) and St George's Hall which will be open for tours on Sunday 10 September. #### **CAPACITY TRACKER – IMPORTANT UPDATE** - THE REALITY OF ENFORCEMENT ACTION

Providers of Care Home and Home Support services should be aware that they are legally required to update the Capacity Tracker.

Fresh data should be input between the 8<sup>th</sup> – 14<sup>th</sup> each month to have a submission recorded.

If data is not entered for 3 consecutive months OR is missing for 4 periods in a rolling 12month period, this omission is likely to result in the Department of Health and Social Care taking action against individual providers with the risk of fines being issued. Data input by providers in this case is mandatory.

The clock was re-set in April 2023 and Bradford Council has been informed that enforcement is now commencing. If providers have not reported in the previous reporting windows then they are at risk of action being taken, particularly if the last two reporting windows have already been missed.

Bradford Council also operates a "vacancy map" for care homes which is used by social workers making placements. The map is populated by the care home vacancy data on the Capacity Tracker. It is updated each Wednesday. Our ask is that you ensure your data is up to date **every Tuesday** to appear on the map. Data input by providers in this case is voluntary.

If any provider does not have access to the Capacity Tracker or needs to refresh their log-in details, please contact the support desk at the Capacity Tracker directly. Training is available (for free) on the Capacity Tracker website, should any provider need support or a refresher on using the system. <u>https://capacitytracker.com</u>

#### LOCAL FRIENDSHIP SUPPORT GRANTS – SUPPORTING THOSE LIVING WITH DEMENTIA AND/OR SENSORY IMPAIRMENTS – ROUND 2

Do you run a friendship or activities club in the Bradford District which would like to become more welcoming and accessible to people living with dementia and/or with sensory impairments?

Do you have ideas about how your group or organisation could support people living with dementia and/or sensory impairments?

Do you have an idea of how you could grow or expand your group to help people build friendships, live independently and be engaged with their local community?

Bradford Council are offering a further round of Local Friendship Support Grants of between £250 - £2,000 to local groups to enable them to become more accessible and offer new opportunities to people living with dementia and/or sensory impairments. This funding could be spent on, but is not limited to, activities, events or equipment. It could also be used to set up a new group or help your existing group become more established. Further details of the criteria can be found in the application guidance.

These grants are now live and all required information is available on the CNet website at <a href="https://cnet.org.uk/Projects/Grants">https://cnet.org.uk/Projects/Grants</a>. The closing date for applications is Monday 11<sup>th</sup> September at 12 noon.

Please note: If you have already successfully applied for a previous round of this funding you are welcome to apply again. You cannot submit the same application but may build on a previous application or apply for something different.

To be successful, applications must focus on the benefit you could have to people living with dementia and their carers and/or people with sensory impairments. However, your group does not need to only support these cohorts.

#### **10 SEPTEMBER - WORLD SUICIDE PREVENTION DAY**

Content warning: Brief mention of suicide

World Suicide Prevention Day is on 10 September. It is an opportunity to raise awareness of suicide and the steps we can take to prevent it and help reduce the stigma surrounding it.

Each week, approximately 115 people die by suicide in the UK. Research has found that as many as 10% of suicides each year could be work-related (Office for National Statistics, Hazards campaign).

We believe that suicide is preventable through education and intervention. That's why we are calling on workplaces to embed suicide awareness, prevention, and support into their mental health and wellbeing strategies.

To ensure more help is given to individuals searching for harmful content online, Alice set up **R**;**pple**; a digital tool that can provide immediate support and comfort to people searching for harmful content on suicide and self-harm. With millions of downloads worldwide, R;pple is intercepting thousands of harmful online searches, continually saving lives from suicide.

The tool is available to organisations so that you give hope and encouragement to people at their most vulnerable point.
