The Local Authority and CCG are reviewing The process of Adult CHC assessment from Checklist through to DST and reviewing (including process for people who are Fast Track, Jointly Funded or in receipt of Funded Nursing Care).

Care Home outbreak testing flowchart: staff and residents

A new variant of concern may affect testing procedures: for full instructions follow the **COVID-19** adult social care services guidance.

1 Have there been 2 or more positive COVID-19 cases in a 14-day period?



No positive tests Continue regular asymptomatic staff testing. If any staff member or resident becomes symptomatic, they should take an LFD test on day 0 and then on day 2. If either of these are positive, follow the guidance in the IPC - COVID-19 Supplement.

Positive case If there is one positive case in the home, staff should conduct rapid response testing for 5 days. If there are further cases

- Continue testing, but do not extend the rapid response testing period beyond 5 days.
- Contact the HPT (or if applicable, your community infection prevention and control team. LA or CCG).

Outbreak Testing

within the 5-day period:

Day 0/1: all staff and residents take PCR* and LFD tests. Days 4 to 7: staff and residents take one PCR* and one LFD on one of these days.

Day 7 onwards: staff continue regular twice weekly symptomatic LFDs.

2 Has it been 10 days since the last member of staff or resident tested positive for COVID-19 or experienced symptoms during the outbreak?



Outbreak continues Continue regular asymptomatic staff testing and continue LFD testing any newly symptomatic individuals.

Were any new positives found?



HPT (or if applicable, your community infection prevention and control team, LA or CCG) will advise you can lift outbreak restrictions and follow normal testing.

HPT (or if applicable, your community infection prevention and control team, LA or CCG) will advise that the outbreak restrictions should continue until no further positives are found.

Have there been any positive cases in the home after outbreak recovery testing?



Regular staff asymptomatic testing continues. If any staff or resident becomes newly symptomatic, they should take an LFD test when they become symptomatic. If this test is negative, take another test 48 hours later. If either of these are positive, follow the guidance in the MTMCCOVID-19 supplement.



This should be classed as a new potential outbreak and the care home should follow the process from step 1.

Bradford Clean Air Zone is coming soon

The Government is introducing Clean Air Zones across England to improve air quality and the health of people who live and work there.

There will be a Clean Air Zone in Bradford which will mean there will be a daily charge to drive into the zone for vehicles that do not meet the required emissions standards.

The Government has not set a start date for the Clean Air Zone in the Bradford district but it will be announced soon.

A Clean Air Zone is a defined area where targeted action is taken to improve air quality.

Through the use of a daily charge for entering the zone, the Council will encourage affected vehicle owners to consider upgrading their vehicles to compliant standards. Bradford will be a Class C+ Clean Air Zone which means there will be charges for all non-compliant vehicle types with the exception of passenger cars (not including private hire cars which will be subject to the daily charge if not compliant).

The Community-led Gardening and Food Growing Grants schemes are funded by Bradford Council Public Health to increase community-led gardening and food growing across the District.


- The scheme will fund new or existing projects that are working with adults, children and young people or undertake inter-generational work
