

FREE REFRESHER TRAINING AND UPDATED GUIDANCE ON FACE TO FACE TRAINING

1. **Skills for Care are providing fully funded refresher training** (funded by Workforce Development Fund and delivered via 12 of their Endorsed Learning Providers).

Aimed at existing care staff who urgently need refresher training which has expired or will expire soon, in order for them to continue to work safely.

There are 8 topic areas and employees can be put on one, or several of these, depending on their need.

The 8 topic areas are: assisting and moving people; basic life support; fire safety; food safety; health & safety awareness; infection prevention & control; medication management; and safeguarding (specifically around isolation).

- Small employers (1-50 staff) 10 learners
- Medium employers (51-249 staff) 20 learners
- Large employers (250+) 30 learners]
