ADULTS COMMISSIONING AND CONTRACT TEAMS' EQUALITIES DATA COLLECTION 2025

We are pleased to announce that the Adults Commissioning and Contract Teams' Equalities Data Collection for 2025 is now officially underway.

This marks the beginning of a crucial month-long effort to gather meaningful data that will help us better understand the people who use our services. LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Following the huge success of the Leadership Development Programmes last year, Bradford Care Association (BCA) is planning to support Registered Managers, Clinical Leads and Nominated Individuals during 2025/2026. Once again, we have arranged access to the Skills for Care practical leadership development programmes, Understanding Self Management, Understanding Performance Management and Understanding Workplace Culture.

These learning programmes will be delivered by Leeds Leadership Academy, in October 2025 and November 2025 and further details are shown below. Care providers are required to pay £135 per person to attend each of the 1 day training courses. Leeds Leadership Academy has the right to charge in full for non-attendance, if a booked place is not cancelled prior to a programme commencing. However, upon successful completion of a training course, eligible adult social care employers can claim reimbursement of the costs from the Learning Development Support Scheme (LDSS).

WINTER VACCINATION CAMPAIGN

The Winter Vaccination Campaign started on 1st October. The letter contains links to an Action Checklist and to record sheets for resident and staff vaccinations. Care staff are urged to get their free flu vaccinations which are available through their GP practice or community pharmacy as soon as possible to protect themselves and those under their care.

SHORT-TERM SUPPORT AND DISCHARGE TO ASSESS PATHWAY 3

Two opportunities will soon be launched via email- so please look out for these.

- 1) Short- Term Support placement into a residential or nursing setting. These placements have historically taken place but without a formal contract. This specification for the service formalises this arrangement and is an addendum to the documentation under the current Provider List. These services will also now be chargeable to the individual under the Council's contribution policy.
- 2) Discharge to Assess Pathway 3. The DTA P3 list has been in operation for a year. The process will be re-opened to allow for new and existing DTA providers to sign up to an updated specification, which includes reference to the new brokerage team being set up. If you wish to deliver these services, you will need to complete the survey, even if you have previously signed up to this.

It is our intention to launch these in October and start in November: this will be via two separate emails which contains a link to a short survey where Providers will confirm they agree to the arrangements.

Delivery under either of these specifications is not mandatory and homes are required to opt-in should they wish to be considered for a placement. By doing so, homes are agreeing to deliver the requirements of the service and accept the contracted rate.

The specification and other documents will be attached to these emails and Providers are advised to familiarise themselves with the documents before completing the survey.

SURVEY ON ACCESSING FUNDING TO SUPPORT INTERNATIONALLY TRAINED NURSES WORKING IN WEST YORKSHIRE IN SOCIAL CARE

West Yorkshire Global Partnerships has funding available to support internationally trained nurses working in social care (employed as Registered Nurses, senior care or care workers) in West Yorkshire.

The Global Partnerships team is working alongside the West Yorkshire Care
Associations to find out the number of internationally trained nurses who are
employed in social care in West Yorkshire and scope what may benefit these workers
to remain in their current employment.

(Note – internationally trained nurses are those who are qualified as a nurse in their own Country but who are employed in social care as either Registered Nurses, senior care workers or care workers)

<u>Fairtrade Fortnight</u> is the Fairtrade Foundation's annual promotion of Fairtrade and the global Fairtrade movement which seeks to raise awareness of the plight of farmers in less developed countries and help them get fairer pay, fairer treatment and fairer futures.

This year's theme is 'Do It Fair'. Choosing Fairtrade products such as Fairtrade tea, coffee, bananas and chocolate ensures farmers receive the Fairtrade Minimum Price for their products and are empowered to invest in their farms, families and futures.
