


Learning from Staff Testing

- In the last update I reported a high number of asymptomatic staff tests coming back as positive this has now been revised down significantly. As of yesterday a total of 5156 tests have been completed at Marley Fields for Council referred staff the vast majority of these are independent sector provider staff. Of these 92% were tests of asymptomatic staff. The overall (symptomatic and asymptomatic) positive test rate is 3%, however only around 58% of providers feedback the results to us. To improve the accuracy of this picture please remember to tell the testing team the results.
- Please ensure that all tests that you collect from Marley Fields are used and returned or returned unused as the ordering of tests relies on evidence of what test have been used. Not returning tests or returning them late will result in fewer tests being available.

Summary of Public Health data

- Care homes: the number of cases and deaths continue to fall in care homes.
- As of 10th June 13 care homes (11.2% of care homes) are reporting either a confirmed or suspected outbreak of COVID-19. To date there have been a total of 319 confirmed cases within these care homes
- The regional R value for the North East and Yorkshire has risen to 0.89 (ranging between 0.75 and 1.04), higher than the 0.8 reported in previous weeks
- To date there have been a total of 1,725 confirmed cases and 504 deaths relating to COVID-19 in Bradford District
