Dear Home Support Providers,

As we approach the challenging winter months, it is essential for all health and care services to work collaboratively to manage increased demand and provide high-quality care. The NHS is implementing several measures to address winter pressures to minimise delays, ensure timely patient care, and promote patient safety. Home Support providers play a critical role in supporting this effort by delivering care for individuals to help prevent unnecessary hospital admissions.

We ask that you work closely with local NHS and social care teams (Bradford Enablement Support Team/Home Support Reviewing Team and Home First Assessment Service Team) to ensure seamless coordination of care. This includes promptly identifying and addressing the needs of your clients to prevent escalation to urgent care services. Your role in providing safe, timely, and well-coordinated post-discharge support is vital in sustaining this progress. Additionally, please ensure your teams are prepared for surges in demand and are aligned with the goal of maintaining the privacy, dignity, and safety of all patients under your care.

Finally, over the Christmas and New Year period frontline services will continue to operate during normal working hours. Note that the People Commissioning Service (which includes the Contract and Quality Team) will be closed throughout the period from 25/12/2024 until 2/1/2025. Thank you for your ongoing commitment and partnership during this critical time.

Cold Weather Provision for Rough Sleepers

When the temperatures are set to fall below zero – as they are this week – Bradford Council puts special provision in place to make sure no-one has to sleep outside. The Cold Weather Provision is a multi-agency partnership, commissioned by Bradford Council, to provide emergency bed spaces across Bradford for people rough sleeping on freezing cold nights. When the temperature is due to fall to zero or below from 1 October until 30 April, the Council's outreach teams are out on the streets across the district, making sure rough sleepers can access the provision. Free employee health checks for local businesses

As part of a pilot a small number of GP practices may be able to provide a free health check event in workplaces within Bradford District. There will be two types of check available, a full NHS check for those eligible (sometimes this includes checking bloods) OR a slightly quicker cardiovascular check. No health data will ever be shared with employers, minimum employee information required before attendance (not health information)

- Help keep employees well.
- Show employees that you value them.
- Convenience of a check at work.
- Trusted health professionals leading the checks.

Falls Activity Co-ordinator training – suitable for anyone organising activities with those at risk of falls

- 1 ½ hours - Bespoke work with community groups to support integrating strength and balance into activity sessions.
