**It has been raised by West Yorkshire ICB that Bradford has the lowest uptake of flu vaccinations in West Yorkshire amongst the elderly population in care homes and other social care settings. Although all care homes in the Bradford area have now had a visit from the GP service or local community pharmacy it is not too late for residents who did not have a flu vaccination at that time to be offered one now.**

**Flu cases and admissions to hospital with flu are on the rise locally and the flu vaccination is the best protect from the worst effects of flu.**

**Flu vaccinations can still be accessed through GPs or pharmacies until the end of March next year.**

**Please can providers remind residents who may have missed or refused their vaccinations that they can still get one now and that it will help protect them in the coming months.**

## **UKHSA SCABIES ALERT**

### **IPC Guidance to Managing Scabies Cases in Communal Residential Settings**

- ▶ Daily Vacuuming of all carpets & soft furnishings, until at least 7 days after treatment started
- ▶ Steam cleaning of all soft furnishings, carpet shampooing will not be as effective at killing the mite
- ▶ Transmission through the environment and environmental objects (Fomite) is a higher risk when Norwegian Scabies is diagnosed
- ▶ Always wear Gloves and apron when in close contact and doff the PPE appropriately into a foot operated bin
- ▶ Avoid excess shaking of any single-use apron when taking off the apron, use appropriate doffing method to avoid any extra potential shedding of the mites, this can be important for taking gloves off as well
- ▶ Separate all laundry, red bag any laundry, wash separately on the hottest cycle: 60 Degrees plus
- ▶ No sharing of any towels or bed linen, all items should be for the persons use and not to be shared with anyone
