The PNA is important because it will be used as the basis for informing decisions when applications for new pharmacies are received and for commissioning of new services within community pharmacies.

ENHANCE PROGRAMME CALL FOR SPONSORS

The NHS England Enhancing Generalist Skills (enhance) programme is an exciting new professional development offer which aims to equip health and care staff with the additional generalist skills required to deliver excellent person-centred care across the evolving complexities of the health and care system.
