DO YOUR STAFF KNOW THERE IS FINANCIAL HELP AVAILABLE TO THEM?

Everybody is feeling the pinch, care workers too. We really need your help so that all the staff you employ know they can apply for a crisis grant if they meet the eligibility criteria. They need to currently be employed in adult social care in the District and live there. If they've had a sudden or unexpected loss of income, or a sudden illness or injury, a relationship breakdown or an unexpected cost which impacts on their ability to work within the care sector they may be eligible for a grant.

City of Bradford Metropolitan District Council have partnered with the Care Workers' Charity to provide crisis grants to care workers living and working within the City of Bradford Metropolitan District (the District) area.

Crisis grants aren't required to be repaid

Crisis grants are available to help with daily living expenses; replacing white goods; essential household items; moving costs; car repairs; fees to prevent eviction;

Bankruptcy and Debt Relief Order (DRO) application fee

If you let all your staff know that there is help available, before they ask, then we may also be able to help those who weren't aware that help is available.

HELPING YOUR RESIDENTS TO VOTE IN THE LOCAL ELECTIONS

It is likely that a number of care home residents, who wish to vote in the local elections, will not have photo ID. This has now become a requirement to attend and will mean that there is support needed to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate. The person will need a recent electronic photograph and National Insurance number / birth certificate / bank statement to apply online.

POTENTIAL FRAUDULENT CAMPAIGN TARGETING UNPAID CARERS

Carers Trust has contacted its network organisations, including Carers' Resource, with concerns about an organisation called Carers Card UK.

The organisation is promoting a Carers Card and asking carers to enter their bank details and pay £14.99 for the card. Its website www.carerscarduk.co.uk prominently displays the logos of organisations widely respected among the unpaid carer community, including the NHS, Carers Trust and Carers UK.

Carers Trust have been in touch with us and notified that neither they, the NHS or Carers UK have consented for their logos to be used to help market the Carers Card UK.

Carers Trust is advising carer support organisations to email unpaid carers in their networks and let them know that Carers Trust has concerns about Carers Card UK and recommends they do not purchase the card.

However, Carers Trust is not referring to this on social media at present, and has advised other organisations not to do so either, as the matter is still being investigated.

POTENTIAL TRAFFIC DISRUPTION AT AIREDALE HOSPITAL NEXT WEEK

Please leave extra time to get to and from Airedale General Hospital if you are due to visit next week, as large sections of a new modular building are being are delivered. From **14 February to 20 February**, large sections of a new modular building, which is going to be used as a new office block, will be brought into the hospital grounds.

During this time there is likely to be some traffic disruption, as temporary traffic lights are being installed on the road through the hospital grounds next to the Diabetes Centre and Airedale Centre for Mental Health.

SAFEGUARDING ROLE OF THE SERVICE MANAGER TRAINING

This two-day, face-to-face programme is aimed at managers and team leaders of any services who contribute to the care or support of adults at risk of abuse and neglect. This can include, for example, housing, education, advocacy and police as well as health and social care. We will explore the experiences and aspirations of adults with care and support needs and discuss practical implications and solutions for managers of services. Using a range of facilitated discussions and interactive group exercises, participants will be encouraged to build on their existing knowledge and experience and to think about how learning can be applied to their particular service, role and responsibilities.

Content includes:

- How adults in Bradford might experience abuse and neglect: With a focus on human rights and 'Making Safeguarding Personal', exploring models of coercion and control to look at how abuse can happen in different situations.
 - The legal frameworks and local arrangements for safeguarding adults: Using legislation and examples from case law to explore how different legal frameworks apply in different situations and how the local multiagency arrangements might work in practice.
 - The Manager's role and contribution to different stages of safeguarding procedures: Practical tips on how to use the procedures most effectively and how the procedures fit with other guidelines such as managing incidents, staff capability and misconduct.
 - Safeguarding Leadership: exploring how participants can monitor safeguarding in their service and create a positive, open safeguarding culture within the staff team.

Following their announcement that <u>free PPE will continue into 2023-24 whilst</u> <u>stocks last</u>, DHSC have published a list indicating anticipated dates when the PPE Portal will run out of free stock for particular items. When this happens providers will need to purchase PPE.

We have been advised that NHS Supply Chain will continue to supply PPE for purchase via the PPE Portal for social care customers. Alternatively, providers may choose to procure PPE from other suppliers. We are awaiting further information on the prices that will be charged by NHS Supply Chain for key items when the free stock runs out.

Estimated stock-out dates by PPE category - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

In order to begin to plan a smooth transition to purchasing PPE we recommend that providers review this list for the items that they frequently order and begin to consider sourcing options (though NHS Supply Chain will remain available, at cost, prices to be confirmed).

Some specific items will run out sooner than others. Whilst type IIR masks and eye protection are likely to be available until autumn, nitrile gloves may run out of stock relatively soon.


We have highlighted the additional cost of PPE, both in our 2023-24 Minimum


Price for Care (we estimate a cost of 59p per hour of care delivered) and also in meetings with officials at DHSC. We note that many local authorities will not have factored this cost into their commissioning rates for the 2023-24 financial year. Concerns have also been raised about the possibility of PPE price increases. We understand DHSC have been undertaking work to confirm that there will be sufficient PPE supply in the market. 


