

Safeguarding Adults E Learning

Level 1 and Level 2

Course Aim

This online training course explains your safeguarding responsibilities surrounding vulnerable adults in the workplace. You will cover how to spot the signs and symptoms of abuse and the correct way to report any safeguarding concerns or suspected abuse you may have. This training is suitable for all levels of staff working in any role where they may encounter vulnerable adults.

The safeguarding adults level 2 training addresses these responsibilities and gives learners a deeper understanding of key safeguarding topics enabling them to apply the knowledge to their workplace.

Target Audience

Level 1 - this training is the minimum level of competence required of all staff/volunteers working in a health and/or social care organisations.

Level 2 - this is the minimum level of competence for all professional staff involved in safeguarding adults work that are in regular contact with patients, service users their families or carers, or public.

Learning Outcomes

- Explain the profound impact some well-known cases of abuse have had on legislation
- Explain the importance of multi-agency cooperation
- Define safeguarding in respect to adults
- Describe what you need to do if a vulnerable adult makes a disclosure or if you suspect abuse
- Explain what whistle-blowing is, what it is not and why it is important.
- List the ways you can reduce the risk of abuse
- List the signs and symptoms of the different types of abuse.
- Outline the responsibilities Level 2 workers may have
