ANNOUNCEMENT ON FREE PPE EXTENSION

The Government made an <u>announcement on the extension of free PPE</u>. The free PPE scheme will be extended until March 2024, or until DHSC's stocks are depleted, in order to provide protection for frontline staff against Covid as part of the government's Living with Covid strategy.

DHSC will continue to supply <u>all categories</u> of PPE according to demand until the end of March 2023. Further information about the extension and the scheme can be found here.

BRONZE, SILVER, GOLD AND PLATINUM AWARDS FOR COVID-19 BOOSTER VACCINATIONS

The Contract and Quality Team is again introducing Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum awards for Care Homes and Home Support Providers based on the uptake of the Covid-19 Boosters amongst staff members.

Providers that receive the Gold or Platinum award will receive a letter of commendation from lain Macbeath, Strategic Director of Health and Wellbeing, and Sarah Muckle, Director of Public Health, at Bradford Council.

The Covid-19 Vaccination Figures are based on data from Capacity Tracker therefore it is crucial that you update regularly.

There is no deadline for these awards. Should your service become eligible for a higher award, we will issue your new award once the uptake of staff evidence stated above is submitted. To find out more about the Capacity Tracker, please visit HERE.

Please note that the figures on the Capacity Tracker do not differentiate between staff that are hesitant and those that are medically not eligible. If you have vaccinated all eligible staff, please email the Commissioning Inbox and we can update your rating on our records.



PAYING ON PLANNED SERVICES

In these exceptional times, in an attempt to help ease the financial and administrative pressures, payments will be made on the planned level of service.

All providers with the exception of residential and nursing homes will be required to keep a record of the actual level of service provided and to supply that information via payment claim forms as soon as possible. Payments will be made on a scheduled basis based on the planned level of service rather than waiting for completed payment claim forms to be supplied. Adjustments to the planned service will be processed as soon as possible after the PCF is returned.

For non-residential providers, please can you update the Payments Team with the email address the electronic payment claim form should be sent to. Please supply the details to cca.payments@bradford.gov.uk For Residential and Nursing homes, payment claim forms will cease to be provided.

For the time being, Residential and Nursing home providers are asked to email details of all discharges or deaths to the Contracts Team as and when they occur to cca.contractsteam@bradford.gov.uk

IMPROVING COVID-19 VACCINATION UPTAKE (HOMELESSNESS) WEBINAR + TESTING UPDATE

Homelessness settings continue to be eligible for free COVID-19 tests. Guidance on how organisations can register and order kits can be found here. We recommend that settings register and order tests as alongside an increase in cases of influenza, prevalence of COVID-19 continues to rise. People experiencing homelessness, and especially those who sleep rough, experience worse health conditions and are much less likely to be vaccinated than the general population – making them at a higher risk from COVID-19. Testing in communal settings has proven vital for controlling infection and preventing outbreaks of COVID-19.

Ordering tests is a simple two-step process that should take no longer than 10 minutes; settings are asked to set up a Unique Organisation Number (UON) here, and then use this to order tests here.

There will be an opportunity to hear from NHS England about the role of local authorities, providers and vaccination centres, and hear good practice examples of local partnership responses to encouraging the uptake of the COVID-19 booster. CARE ENGLAND'S SURVEY REQUEST FOR CARE PROVIDERS

Care England is deeply concerned over the future funding and workforce challenges facing Adult Social Care due to the lack of central government funding, and is seeking urgent care home and home care provider support by the 13th of January to help argue the case to government via the Sector Pulse Check 2022

Having partnered with Hft, a national charity, to deliver this year's Sector Pulse Check survey which previously focused on learning disability services only, Care England's involvement is expanding the scope of the survey to include older persons' care for the first time creating one of the most significant datasets for England Adult Social Care sector. The annual report will deliver vital data about the financial health of the adult social care sector and the challenges providers are facing. It has never been more critical that providers engage to provide the key information and evidence essential to lobbying central government for additional support now! as our sector needs to evidence the severity of these issues and seek a resolution which we cannot do without your involvement.

INFORMATION REGARDING POWER CUTS FROM CARE ENGLAND

Please read the information regarding power cuts from Care England below.

The Energy Networks Association (ENA) has provided power cut information and advice for anyone responsible for running care home services, people who work in a care home setting and those who manage assisted-living residences. This is important to understand in light of the fact that the Department of Health and Social Care has confirmed the care sector is not explicitly eligible to be prioritised for electricity under the Electricity Supply Emergency Code. This was brought to light by Care England in our recent press release. The information and advice can be found here.

The ENA has provided a Health and Social Care Briefing Note which sets out their power cut and business continuity advice. The note can be found here. In addition, they have also provided a Winter Ready Pamphlet for anyone responsible for running care home services, people who work in a care home setting and those who manage assisted-living residences, which can be found here.

Registered Covid 19 Deaths in Care Homes by Week Ending Date









Bradford Care Homes with a Covid-19 Outbreak

By informing the Trusted Assessors based in Bradford Royal Infirmary and Airedale Hospital when service users have been admitted, they will allocate a worker to act as a key worker and support with communication between the wards and service provider to ensure a smooth discharge. The Trusted Assessors can assist with moving and handling and equipment queries as well as ensuring that the current package of care is adequate to meet their needs on discharge. Please use this service as so far only a handful of providers are regularly sending this information. HOMECARE ASSOCIATION

Please read the following information provided by Homecare Association below.

In <u>our letter last year to the Prime Minister</u>, Rishi Sunak, we warned that demand for homecare is far outstripping supply, with many providers constrained by severe challenges with retention and recruitment of careworkers. We have now received <u>a reply from Social Care Minister</u>, Helen Whately, confirming current social care policy initiatives.

Our request for cost of care exercises to be published looks to have been heeded – <u>councils</u> <u>are due to publish them on their GOV.UK webpages by 1 February 2023</u>. The letter also says that DHSC is contacting local authorities when they need to check on compliance with grant conditions. It states that at least seventy-five per cent of the allocation of funding to local authorities in year one is to be spent on increasing fee rates. They are aware that some local authorities have given some providers one-off cash payments without increasing the fee rate. Others have not yet given any extra money to providers in any form.

Social care featured in the five pledges made by the PM this week to deliver "peace of mind" to the British public. He stated that "NHS waiting lists will fall and people will get the care they need more quickly" and "The most pressing priority we have is to move people into social care in the communities to get ambulances flowing and make sure people are moving quickly into A&E to be seen."

Rising winter infections have prompted <u>UKHSA to remind the public</u> of the need to be vaccinated and take care when unwell. The current rules which apply to professional careworkers on infection control and mask wearing are <u>here</u>.

The Department of Health and Social Care have published <u>guidance for prospective</u> <u>international applicants for health and social care jobs in the UK</u>, which you may wish to refer to in your recruitment material.

Further advice has been issued to health and social care organisations to help them include power cuts in their business contingency plans. Care providers need to be aware that they do not qualify for priority electricity.

Finally, our CEO, Dr Jane Townson, would like to thank members for the many messages of congratulation she has received, following the announcement in the New Year's Honours List.
