The WEA is a registered charity and the UK's largest voluntary sector provider of adult education in England and Scotland. Our Step into care programme connects you to people who want to develop a long-term career in social care. All participants will be appointed through a values-based online recruitment process and will be subject to employment checks prior to a placement with you. Learners will undertake a five-week education programme, delivered through tutor-led, online distance learning that will focus on the theoretical elements of the care certificate. CARE PROVIDER ALLIANCE CQC SINGLE ASSESSMENT FRAMEWORK FEEDBACK

Please can all CQC registered providers complete the survey below which will form part of independent review of CQC Single Assessment Framework (SAF) being conducting by the Care Provider Alliance (CPA), which will in turn feed into Sir Mike Richards national review of the SAF for both NHS and ASC.

It is our opportunity for providers to shape the CQC recovery plan and how the sector will be regulated in future.

The BCA are also feeding directly into the review and separately we would like to speak with any Bradford provider who have experienced an assessment/inspection under the new SAF (Feb 24 onwards). This survey is the first part of a project undertaken by the Care Provider Alliance, which is working across the adult social care community to ensure that as many care providers as possible have a voice in the CQC's review of the Single Assessment Framework (The Independent Review of the CQC by Dr Penny Dash identified a number of specific concerns about the SAF which has led to this review).

The first stage of this review will focus on your operational experiences of the Single Assessment Framework, either in preparation or during inspection. This is open for managers/ deputy managers/ senior managers/ nominated individuals/ quality/ compliance leads working in a regulated care service to respond to.

Feedback from this survey will inform the second stage of this project, which will look more closely at what people want for the future.



WEST YORKSHIRE STRATEGIC WORKFORCE TRANSFORMATION FORUM

Apprenticeship expansion

The remit of this group would be to develop a plan to deliver against the strategic intent for apprenticeship growth across West Yorkshire, taking into account workforce gaps and the potential for apprenticeships to transform the workforce of the future, including gathering evidence, scoping and mapping existing provision and considering how to optimise the use of funding for maximum benefit across the system

Scaling up – Supply /Scaling up – Demand

Supply: The remit of this group would be to develop a collaborative West Yorkshire system approach to placement allocation, including scoping of current placement capacity and the capacity for expansion in the education sector and in provider organisations, identifying where there are significant gaps in placement capacity, exploring how we can secure the educator workforce of the future without destabilising services and considering can be done differently

Demand: The remit of this group would be to develop a West Yorkshire system approach to workforce planning, including increasing capacity and capability for workforce planning, the need to ensure that the right enablers, such as access to workforce data, are in place to inform outcomes, and to bring together collective workforce intelligence and insights to identify areas of greatest risk

Workforce and Skills Development

The remit of this group would be to develop a West Yorkshire system approach to workforce skills development and transformation to enable and support service transformation, including new roles, new ways of working, educational opportunities, curriculum design and collaboration around common assessment standards and placement allocation Understanding the current position and the art of the possible, providing leadership and pooling of capacity to maximise impact.
