NEW LOCATION FOR SHOPMOBILITY

Shopmobility, which supports adults of all ages with health and mobility issues, is moving to a new location in the Broadway, Bradford.

Shopmobility, is a nationwide network of centres with local schemes across UK, providing people who may have restricted mobility through temporary or permanent illness or injury, have trouble walking long distances or have a disability to hire out mobility equipment.

Adult Social Care trained staff will provide users with the support needed, advising how to use the equipment effectively and safely which must be returned to the unit on the same day. Vehicles and scooters are available to use for residents of Bradford as well as visitors to area who must be over the age of 18 with a disability or mobility problem.

The service will be located in Unit 66, Well Street of the Broadway Centre and will be open, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday Friday (9pm - 5pm) and Wednesday and Saturday (9am - 1pm).

You can contact your Shopmobility site either in person or by phone and all users must register to use the service. The service is free of charge, however donations are welcome which will contribute to the running cost of the service.



By Car

The city has plenty of good quality parking within easy reach of Bradford Live.

Parking can be pre-booked at The Broadway Car Park, which is a 400 m /five-minute walk from Bradford Live and offers 1,467 spaces.

Other nearby car parks are:

NCP Southgate (432 spaces) 200 m, 2 minute walk

Leisure Exchange (997 spaces) 700 m, 10 minute walk

By Bus

Most bus services to Bradford terminate at Bradford Interchange, a 10 minute walk to Bradford Live.

Buses in all directions depart frequently from the Interchange. Plan your bus journey here: Plan a journey | Metro

First Bus operate a 24/7 service between Bradford and Leeds: 72 & X6

Buses to the west of the city depart regularly from the bus stops adjacent to the venue.

By Train

Bradford Live is approximately a 10-minute walk from Bradford Interchange.

Train times are available from National Rail. There are taxi services at the station.
