HELP SHAPE OUR FIRST EVER PARTNERSHIP AWARDS

Our Bradford District and Craven Health and Care Partnership has some exciting news, this year we will be holding our first place-based awards. NATIONAL EMERGENCY ALERT TEST (23 APRIL): SUPPORTING PEOPLE WITH LD AND AUTISM

On Sunday 23 April there will be a national UK Emergency Alert test. This new Emergency Alert system is being rolled out by the government and will notify all phones with an alert sound - including when they are on silent. We are aware that such an alert, including the sound, could cause anxiety for a number of vulnerable people including those with a learning disability or those with autism. Please could you help by sharing this message to people with learning disability or those with autism as well as their families and carers. The latest announcement by the government confirms that the emergency sound will go off on nearly all smartphones at 3pm on Sunday 23 April.

CARERS PARKING IN RESIDENTS ONLY AREAS – APPLY FOR A PERMIT TO REGISTER YOUR STAFF'S VEHICLES

There are two different types of permit.

• For family members who are carers visiting a permit area then they would be able to apply for a 'Special Permit' which are free of charge and approved by Highways for the carer to visit a particular location or scheme.

• Care Providers can apply for a permit per vehicle for their care staff, under "Health Visitor" permits. Health visitor permits enable visiting carers to park in limited wait bays and residential parking areas for up to two hours

THE CARE WORKERS CHARITY CRISIS GRANT HAS ENDED

The Council's partnership with The Care Workers' Charity to provide crisis grants to care workers has now come to an end as the funding has all been allocated. £50,000 worth of grants have been paid to care workers facing a sudden or unexpected loss of income in the District since June 2022.

EASTER BANK HOLIDAY AND JUNIOR DOCTORS STRIKE

Junior doctors in England will go on strike from Tuesday, 11 April until Saturday, 15 April. NHS teams continue to work hard to minimise disruption from the industrial action, but it is expected that there will be a significant impact on local health services.

Regardless of any strike action, the NHS is advising on the importance of anyone who needs urgent medical care to continue to come forward in the normal way – calling 999 or going to your nearest Accident and Emergency (A&E) department, especially in emergency and life-threatening cases – when someone is seriously ill or injured, or their life is at risk. People should continue to also attend planned appointments unless they are contacted.

People are being asked to check their medication supplies and to visit NHS 111 online first for health advice over what is expected to be a busy period for NHS services over the Easter bank holiday (7-10 April) and until the end of junior doctor strike action (11-14 April).

Health advice and information is available from NHS 111, which is free and can be accessed by phone or online. It can tell you where and how to get help for your symptoms and arrange a telephone call with a healthcare professional if appropriate. You can also use the <u>NHS website to find an open pharmacy</u> near you.

Emotional support is also available over this period through Guide-Line between 8am and 12am on 08001 884 884 or the <u>Healthy Minds website</u> to get help. For 24/7 urgent mental health crisis support, people should contact First Response on 08009521181.

ONLINE MENOPAUSE AWARENESS SESSIONS

At West Yorkshire Health and Care Partnership, we are working together to support our workforce and raise awareness around menopause. We have a number of <u>Menopause Awareness sessions</u> taking place over the next year, these sessions will focus on helping everyone understand what it is like for those being impacted by physical and emotional symptoms of the menopause so they can better understand how to support their employees/colleagues, family and friends. They will also focus on what menopause is, why and when it happens and ways of managing symptoms. Participants will gain confidence in having supportive conversations around menopause and how to get the right support together including the important role a partner, team or family member can play.

IPC CHANGES FROM 3 APRIL

IPC COVID-19 Supplement - updated to reflect changes

From Monday, the testing regime is being significantly relaxed for adult social care. Testing will be provided to individuals and settings at the highest risk from COVID-19 but only LFD tests will be used in social care. Routine symptomatic testing of staff and residents in care settings will end and will only be advised for those eligible for COVID-19 treatments (in care homes and in extra care and supported living) and during suspected outbreaks in care homes. Testing is not available in other settings.

People with symptoms of a respiratory infection who are not eligible for COVID-19 treatments do not need to test but should stay away from others until they feel well again and do not have a temperature. This includes staff with symptoms.

People who test positive for COVID-19 should stay away from others for a minimum of 5 days and until they feel well and no longer have a temperature. Testing is no longer required for individuals to return to normal before 10 days following a positive test.

Rapid response testing will no longer be needed in care homes or extra care and supported living settings.

If there is a suspected or confirmed outbreak in a care home, there is no longer a need to test the whole home. Instead, only the first 5 linked symptomatic residents should take a LFD to assess if there is an outbreak of 2 or more residents displaying respiratory symptoms within 14 days.

Outbreak measures in care homes should not only focus on protecting those who are at highest-risk from COVID-19. Measures can be lifted 5 days after the last positive or suspected case. Recovery testing is no longer required.

There should not be any restrictions on visits out for individuals who are not symptomatic or who have not tested positive in any circumstance.

Hospital admissions to care homes should test with a LFD within 48 hours before discharge. PCRs should no longer be taken.

Community admissions do not need to test.

PCR tests may be used if advised and supplied by the NHS for an individual eligible for COVID-19 treatments who has tested positive, or if advised by an HPT during an outbreak.

Anyone falling out of the scope of the above, should following the guidance for the general public.




