Acute deterioration in care home residents: recognising and responding to acutely unwell residents.

With the support and guidance of Professor Adam Gordon, I am conducting care home research as part of my PhD to understand how acute deterioration is recognised and responded to in residents.

The purpose is to provide a platform for care home staff to be heard and share their experiences of caring for residents that become suddenly unwell. Care home voices, experiences and perspectives are missing from the current evidence and the question of how acute deterioration is identified and managed is yet to be explored in-depth. We need to better understand acute deterioration from the perspectives of care home staff so that we can generate care home specific approaches to managing this condition in our residents.

There are two main studies that have had some responses from care homes in England. To make the PhD meaningful and relevant to care homes, we need more care home staff to take part in the studies and share their experiences.

Study 1 - is a brief survey about acute deterioration. Anyone that works in a care home can participate – click the link below or scan the QR code.

Study 2 – is an informal chat with the researcher (in person or online) about your experiences of caring for unwell residents.

This research cannot succeed without the support of care homes. It is pivotal that care home staff have a say in shaping the care they deliver to some of the most vulnerable members of society.

The Bradford Cares Recruitment Portal for Adult Social Care has been developed for two main purposes: for care providers to advertise their job vacancies; and to inform individuals looking for work about the sector, the range of jobs available and the career / progression opportunities the sector can offer.

Bradford Cares will become a 'one stop shop' to help 'match' people looking for work in the adult care sector with care providers who have job vacancies.

HOW DO I GET MY JOB VACANCIES ON BRADFORD CARES FOR FREE?

BCA will provide a service for independent care providers, who are BCA members, to upload their job vacancies to the portal for no charge.

BCA membership is currently free - if you're not a BCA member already or are unsure if you are, please email admin@bradfordcareassociation.org

Simply email admin@bradfordcareassociation.org requesting the job vacancy form. You will then fill out the form which will ask you questions about the job vacancy.

Once you have completed the job vacancy form, the BCA will add your vacancy to the job portal for free! BCA will keep in touch with you to see if you have success with recruiting using the Bradford Cares Portal.

Additionally, if you have vacancies and are trying to recruit staff, please do contact Bradford SkillsHouse who can help and support you with the entire recruitment process and can provide candidates with Care Certificate training (if the candidate is currently unemployed) for no charge.

Also, if you interview candidates and they are not successful in gaining a position with you, please can you advise the candidates to contact SkillsHouse, who will support them to look for work and undertake relevant care training.

We know from experience that care workers sometimes find it difficult to let their others know they are struggling, whether it's to help with daily living expenses, replacing washing machines or other essential white goods, moving costs, travel expenses to hospital, or car repairs or fees to prevent eviction.

City of Bradford Metropolitan District Council have partnered with **The Care Workers' Charity** and made funding available to care workers who work and live in the District to help with:

- Daily living expenses
- · Essential whitegoods, like washing machines
 - · Essential household items
 - Moving costs
 - Health improvement aids and adaptations
 - Travel expenses to hospital
 - Essential household repairs
 - Car repairs
- Bankruptcy and Debt Relief Order (DRO) application fee
 - Fees to prevent eviction
