Hi-Vis UK are currently developing an on-line OCN Level 3 Course – Specialist Deaf Blind Assessor. Whilst this is primarily for Staff in Health and Social Care undertaking Care Act Assessments, it is useful for others who may be involved in assessment processes. This course should be available within the next few weeks.

As this is a validated course there is a charge.
